

ORDINANCE NO. 878

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BAYPORT, WASHINGTON COUNTY, MINNESOTA
AMENDING CHAPTER 46 – SOLID WASTE, ARTICLE III. STORAGE, COLLECTION, AND
DISPOSAL OF THE BAYPORT CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES**

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BAYPORT DOES HEREBY ORDAIN:

Section 1. Chapter 46 – Solid Waste, Article III. Storage, Collection, and Disposal, Section 46-58 Bulk materials is hereby amended by deleting the same in its entirety and substituting the following therefore:

Sec. 46-58. Bulk materials.

Bulk materials intended for temporary storage or disposal must be kept in an enclosed building or a special bulk container, which has been approved by the city. Bulk containers must be located on private property at least five (5) feet from all property lines, must be supplied by a city licensed waste hauler or company, are limited to one (1) container per property, and must be removed within thirty (30) days, unless otherwise approved by the city. For construction of a new residential home, two (2) bulk containers are allowed per property for up to six (6) months. Containers for any property in the city shall not be filled to the extent that garbage, recyclables, or refuse placed therein can drop or spill from them.

A certain property and/or event that requires a bulk dumpster, but due to topography, or special and unique circumstances deemed appropriate by the city which prevent the bulk container from being placed on private property, may be eligible for a dumpster permit to allow placement on city property or public right-of-way. Prior to placement, the property owner or party requesting the bulk container is responsible for obtaining a city permit. Fees associated with this permit have been adopted and are designated in Appendix D – Fee Schedule of the Bayport City Code of Ordinances.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication according to law. Passed by the Bayport City Council this 6th day of January, 2020.
